## **Acting Head of European Neighbourhood Programme**

Ján Cingel is a research fellow at the European Neighborhood Programme of the GLOBSEC Policy Institute, which is a think-tank of the GLOBSEC organization, Slovakia-based organization and think-tank.

Before transferring to the GLOBSEC Policy Institute, he worked as a project manager of the European Neighborhood Development Programme at GLOBSEC (previously the Slovak Atlantic Commission) for five years (since 2011).

His area of expertise is the Western Balkans, South Caucasus, NATO, and EU integration related issues and processes. He has run projects in Serbia, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Macedonia, Kosovo, Georgia and Armenia.

Before joining the Slovak Atlantic Commission, Ján worked at the Bilateral relations office of the Defence Policy, International Relations and Legislation Department of the Ministry of Defence of the Slovak Republic in 2008 - 2010.

He is one of the co-founders of the Bratislava Global Security Forum - GLOBSEC (2005).

Ján graduated from the Faculty of Political Sciences and International Relations of the Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica, Slovakia with the MA degree in International Relations and diplomacy (2007).

In his numerous articles and publications he has dealt extensively with issues like: political changes in the Western Balkans' countries; NATO's relations with Serbia; Montenegro's integration to the NATO; violent extremism and radicalization; foreign fighters; Russia's influence in neighboring countries; transformation processes in Georgia and the Nagorno Karabakh conflict.
