




The Russian cruiser "Moskva" (forefront) training with NATO ships in the Ionian Sea, 14 February 2006

ARTICLE 5

"The Parties agree that an armed attack against one or more . . . shall be considered an attack against them all and . . . each of them . . will assist the Party or Parties so attacked by taking . . . such action as it deems necessary, including the use of armed force, to restore and maintain the security of the North Atlantic area. "






