 - Streamlined cyber defense governance
 - Procedures for assistance to Allied countries
 - Integration of cyber defense into operational planning
 - Enhancing awareness, education, training and exercise activities
 - Boosting NATO's cooperation with industry

NATO Open Door Policy

- > Article 10, the North Atlantic Treaty
- > 1995 Study on Enlargement
 - ✓ a functioning democratic political system based on a market economy
 - ✓ the fair treatment of minority populations
 - ✓ a commitment to the peaceful resolution of conflicts
 - ✓ the ability and willingness to make a military contribution to NATO operations; and
 - ✓ a commitment to democratic civil-military relations and institutional structures.
